The size of the pen or the ground conditions made no difference to Goofy, he won in all classes, in all different arenas, no matter where he was shown. In all the years Bruce ran the sorrel gelding, he was lame only one time, and that was when he was a three year old.

Goofy and Bruce won the Buckle for Open Contesting at Kendalville, Indiana several times. Bruce fondly remembers when the pair won the Open Contesting when Goofy was 20 years old and then came back and won again when he was 23. "He had a lot of heart."

As Goofy started getting up in years, Ruth (Bruce's wife) advised him to let their two nieces, Jessica and Harley Jo Spence, show Goofy at the Putnam County Indiana 4-H Fair. They showed Goofy for four years and did very well on him. Goofy managed to make two more cowgirls before leaving this world.

Bruce added that he... "...just wanted to Praise the Lord and thank Him for the opportunity to own such a horse." He was also very thankful he could share him with family. Goofy was a wonderful horse and will surely be missed by his family who loved him, and everyone else who saw him run throughout the years.
